PREFACE.

In 1920, there was published for private circulation from the press of Mr. A. L. Humphreys, of 187 Piccadilly, London, a descriptive Catalogue of the Welsh Book-Plates then in the collection of Sir Evan Davies Jones, Bart., of Pentower, Fishguard, together with a number of biographical and heraldic notes by myself. Since that date a good many more Book-Plates connected with Wales have come to light, some of these additions being of special interest and importance. Sir Evan Jones has therefore decided to print privately a Supplement, dealing with these additional specimens on the same lines as the Catalogue of 1920. It is needless to remark that all the book-plates described in these two volumes, about 1700 in all, represent only a portion of the sum-total of Welsh Book-Plates both old and modern. Still, this Catalogue in conjunction with the present Supplement will afford a fair insight into this interesting section of Welsh literary history from the close of the seventeenth century down to the present day.
