REPORT ON AUCTION 82 - HELD ON 2 SEPTEMBER 2017

Ten royal bookplates sold for a total of £1,125, headed by Prince Christian (Lee #40) at £230 (lot 182) and Queen Mary (Lee #126) at £210 (lot 184), with the tiny label for Princess Victoria (Lee #145) reaching a surprising £160 (lot 179). Another surprise was the price of £86 for a fine and large modern armorial for the Marquess of Linlithgow (lot 86). An early armorial c.1705 for the Duke of Devonshire sold for £76 (lot 171). Keen competition was seen for a pretty label of the Dromore Reading Society 1794 (lot 22) which sold to an Irish collector for £64. In contrast, the two 17thC armorials for Bradshaw and Southwell (lots 173 and 174) seemed underpriced at £70 and £50 respectively. A total of £439 was expended by the buyers of 31 bookplates engraved by Jack Badeley (nine lots 136-144). By Eve, the Maryon-Wilson pictorial (lot 154) in mint condition fetched £58. Eight bookplates by EH New (lots 130 & 131) cost two buyers £55. At the bargain end of the sale were 43 lots which sold for £10 or less (their aggregate total was £341). In these lots were bookplates that turn up frequently or were not in good condition. One of our room bidders obliged us as a "human hoover" of such lots, and this material will probably reappear in due course on ebay as individual items. Sixteen lots were unsold, namely lot numbers 54, 55, 65, 76, 93, 97, 98, 103, 113, 119, 123, 124, 126, 147, and 151. There are also duplicates available of lots 85 and 129.
